## COURT CARE FOR THE PIKES PEAK REGION 2013-2014 Report to the Community



### Court Care has cared for more than 40,000 children since 2003!

The El Paso County Terry R. Harris Judicial Complex is the second busiest courthouse in the state. Every year tens of thousands of cases are heard, including public examinations of our society's most horrifying crimes: murder, rape, domestic violence, drugs, and other troubling crimes. Every day our court's dockets are filled with highly sensitive and often vitriolic hearings on divorce and child custody.

**Court Care ensures children are not present to see or hear these stories graphically reiterated in court.** Court Care provides free, licensed childcare for any court-user. Our facility is located inside the courthouse, is highly secure, and offers children a fun, educational, and safe alternative to sitting in courtrooms.

**El Paso County's Judicial Complex is the only courthouse in Colorado that offers onsite childcare.** In nearby communities, children are brought to courthouses and do not have a place they can safely go while their parents are in court. Elsewhere children are permitted to sit in courtroom galleries or are left unattended to roam courthouse hallways. The physical safety issues are palpable when you consider that many people are at courthouses for criminal cases, including kidnapping and child sexual abuse. In Colorado Springs, Court Care ensures children are protected, and it's not just a few children – it's thousands each year. In fact, since our founding in 2003, Court Care has cared for more than 40,000 children!



We believe justice is best served when children are safe and parents can fully participate in their legal proceedings without the distraction children may cause.

# Letter from the Co-Presidents

Dear Friends, Colleagues and Supporters of Court Care:

We are humbled and honored to present this year's Annual Report. As we look over all that we accomplished in 2013-2014, it's easy to see the impact Court Care has made in terms of pure numbers. This year we cared for 4,191 children from 2,910 households. We can look deeper into our numbers and see that many of the families using Court Care are among our community's most vulnerable members.

We believe Court Care's impact is substantial and potentially circumvents significant trauma. We know that the 4,191 children at Court Care did not see their parents' vitriolic divorce or child custody hearings, did not watch mothers testify about domestic violence or rape, did not hear a loved one being tried for a crime, and did not witness parents in shackles being sentenced to prison. Instead, children were safe and having fun – playing, reading, and painting – while their loved ones' legal proceedings played out in the courthouse.

Court Care's work is only possible because of the generous support of individuals -like you- who believe in investing to protect our community's greatest resource, our children. 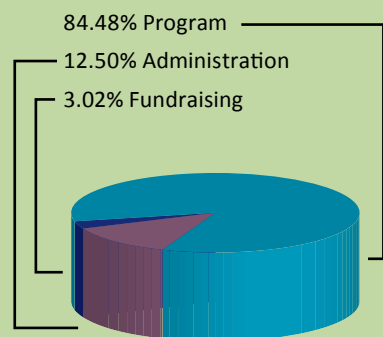


### Breakdown by Percentage



### FINANCIAL NOTES:

We are pleased to report Court Care's overall financial health improved in FY14. Expenses remained stable and income levels grew slightly; the combined result was ending this fiscal year with a modest surplus. This rise in income was due to several key initiatives. Court Care participated in the 2013 Give! campaign, which helped boost the community's awareness and support for Court Care's services. Court Care's 2nd Annual Protect the Children 5K Run / Walk in April 2014 nearly doubled its net earnings. Finally, several key funding agencies offered new or increased support for services provided.

The Board of Directors continues to explore new sources of funding with the ultimate goal being organizational sustainability. In 2014-2015, Court Care will again participate in the Give! campaign, has been selected to be part of the Colorado Combined Campaign, and will seek new and expanded relationships and partnerships with funders throughout the community and state.
