2015-2016 Report to the Community

50,000 Children Have Visited Court Care

On October 13, 2016 Court Care hit the momentous milestone of having cared for 50,000 children since our founding in 2003. It's hard to picture 50,000 people – but that would fill Red Rocks Amphitheatre 5.25 times!

One of our earliest advocates recently related being in the El Paso County Judicial Complex with child victims before Court Care existed. She recalled seeing an eight-year-old girl who had been physically abused testify in court. When the little girl finished testifying, she sat down in the gallery because she had nowhere else to go. The girl's mother spat on her child as she sat down.

This advocate remembered that it was common for child victims to have to sit in courtrooms with the person who hurt them throughout their entire trial. Prior to Court Care thousands of children had to watch and be watched in court by people who had abused them because they did not have another safe place to go. **This did not happen for the 50,000 kids who visited Court Care.**

We are working to ensure that Court Care is free and available for the next 50,000 children who need childcare while their parents are in court. Because we believe that all children should be safe and protected.

FINANCIAL OVERVIEW:

Court Care ended the fiscal year with a positive surplus due to several factors. **Expenses were lower this past year over the previous year.** Staffing costs were down due to a six-month position vacancy. **Overall revenue was stable from the previous year.** Several of our supporters increased their funding during the year, and we obtained a few new partners. Overall, earnings in the 2015 Give! campaign and in the Protect the Children 5K were stable compared to the prior year. Thanks to strong partnerships with Early Connections Learning Centers, El Paso County, and the Fourth Judicial District, we are one of only two courthouses

in the State of Colorado that offers onsite, free childcare for court-users. While parents got

divorced, hashed out child custody, testified about a crime, sought a protection order, were sentenced to prison, or participated in any number of other mature court matters, their children were allowed to be children and simply **play** – 50,000 times.

To put this number in perspective, 50,000 people would fill Coors Field to capacity or would fill The Broadmoor World Arena more than six times!

A LOOK BACK



Early 1990s

Chuck Murphy brings Diane Price, CEO of Early Connections Learning Centers, an article from Massachusetts about a program offering childcare for court-users there.

Mid-1990s

Two separate committees form at different times with representatives from Early Connections Learning Centers, CASA, Safe Passage, TESSA, and other concerned agencies trying to found this program. Ultimately, these efforts fail.

1997

Jan Weiland is serving on TESSA's Board of Directors and notices how many children are in TESSA's offices during the day while their caregivers seek temporary restraining orders. Since permanent protection orders require a visit to the courthouse Jan asks "where do these children go then?" the answer "with their mothers to court." Jan meets with Diane Price and revives the previous committees, convenes monthly meetings, and begins working toward founding the program that will become Court Care.



March 1999

Colleen Denny spearheaded a collaboration with the Junior League of Colorado Springs. JLCS adopted the Court Care program to be their featured 75th anniversary project. The Court Care committee begins fundraising and grant writing initiatives. Lizanne Stableford joins this project in September 1999.

October 1999

The State of Colorado adopts the Family Friendly Court Act, which mandates judicial districts to provide accommodations for families and also designates funding for court-user childcare services (a portion of a fee from traffic violations). Colorado State Chief Supreme Court Justice Mary Mullarkey champions this act.

2000

With strong support for Court Care from El Paso County Administrator Terry R. Harris, El Paso County purchases 309 S Cascade Avenue and allocates space for Court Care in this building.

2001 – 2002

Operating in partnership with Early Connections Learning Centers, Court Care launches a pilot program to provide childcare for court-users in Judge Theresa Cisneros' docket. While usage numbers were small, feedback from parents was positive.

October 2002

Received formal 501 (c) 3 non-profit status.

May 2003

Court Care became a Donor Advised Fund at the Pikes Peak Community Foundation.

June 20, 2003

Court Care opened its doors to all court-users in a center located at 309 S Cascade. Court Care partners with Early Connections Learning Centers for center operations.

2006

Court Care moves into its permanent location inside the El Paso County Terry R. Harris Judicial Complex following the courthouse's renovation and expansion. The space is designed specifically for Court Care's usage.

Summer 2010

Court Care hits the milestone of having cared for 25,000 children.

October 2016

Court Care has cared for 50,000 children.
