COURT CARE FOR THE PIKES PEAK REGION

2017-2018 Report to the Community

Court Care Provides a Safe, Protective Environment for Kids in Need

Do you remember, as a child, the first time you heard a parent or other adult yell or raise their voice in anger? Now that you're older, being in earshot of a loud, enraged adult may still be un-nerving. But to a child, that experience can be terrifying; even life-altering.

Court Care lets children avoid heated, contentious courtroom proceedings involving their parents (who may be battling over divorce, abuse, child molestation, or other serious charges) by putting them in the safe and happy environment of an on-site childcare center called Court Care. Children learn and play in a setting just steps away from the courtroom—but world's away from the unsettling sights and sounds of

confrontational adults. Thanks to Court Care, a child never has to enter the courtroom with his or her parent(s).

In 2017, Court Care looked after more than 5,200 children ages 6 weeks to 14 years—whose parents were called to court in the Pikes Peak Region. A mom recently described to us the positive impact Court Care had on her family:

Sarah was facing a contentious divorce. Her husband was bipolar and refused medication and treatment. Their home life became increasingly unstable, abusive, and violent. Sarah knew she had to protect herself and their three-yearold son, Toby. She had always tried to keep Toby safe and isolated from the abuse, but Sarah realized it was having a negative impact on his social, psychological, and physical development. She tried to escape with her son to her parent's

house after one particularly bad incident, but her enraged husband followed them. The next day, she filed for a restraining order and for a divorce.

In order to get a restraining order and begin her divorce proceedings, Sarah needed to appear in court on multiple occasions. Her family members were also her witnesses, and she feared for her son's safety if she left him with a neighbor or a babysitter. When Sarah learned about Court Care and the security measures Court Care puts in place, she felt comforted about moving forward with her divorce proceedings. Court Care took care of Sarah's son every time she needed to be in court. Toby loved working on art projects and enjoyed choosing a book to bring home after each visit.

Sarah says, "I am so grateful to Court Care. There were things being discussed in the courtroom that no innocent child should have to hear or see. I would not have been able to give the testimonies my full attention if I also needed to keep Toby quiet during my proceedings. The Court Care staff was invaluable to me. To Toby, they provided a loving, nurturing blanket of care and attention that he needed and deserved."



FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

Fiscal year 2018 ended with a modest budget surplus. This was due to a small overall revenue increase compared to the previous fiscal year, and despite reduced support from Colorado's Family Friendly Court Act. Overall expenses increased due to staffing costs and high program usage numbers. Court Care has increased staffing and adapted to the minimum wage increases. Court Care had a successful Give! Campaign and a positive Protect the Children 5K event. Both raise funds and awareness for Court Care.

Letter from the Co-Presidents

Dear Friends and Colleagues:

Crime is up 20% in the Pikes Peak region. Courtroom dockets are overflowing. Thousands of children are being brought into the courthouse, and more children are being safely and lovingly cared for at Court Care – more than at any other time in our 15-year history. Court Care provides free, licensed childcare for any parent or guardian who needs to be in court in the Pikes Peak Region. In fiscal year 2018, Court Care cared for 5,208 children. Since our founding in 2003, more than 60,000 children have experienced the comfort and care of our services.

By providing childcare for court-users, Court Care allows children to be insulated and protected from the potentially traumatic testimony that is presented in courtrooms every day. Court Care allows children who may be exposed to abusive and neglectful circumstances in other parts of their lives to just be children and play during that time. Court Care's services give struggling parents the freedom to speak with dignity and the right to fully participate in their legal proceedings without their children seeing, hearing, or possibly distracting them. Court Care helps judges and justice personnel complete their jobs more effectively, and it helps the court system run more efficiently. In order to ensure we have the staffing we need to accommodate the demand for our services, Court Care has increased the number of childcare teachers and program budget expenses. In fact, just as we are seeing the highest numbers of children in our history, Court Care's program budget is also the largest ever approved by the organization.
