2019–2020 Report to the Community

To Court Care, you are a steward of HOPE, To Lexi and Katy, you are a HERO

In fiscal year 2019–2020, Court Care had the privilege of welcoming over 4,094 children into its free drop-in childcare center, located inside the El Paso County courthouse in Colorado Springs.

Before Court Care's founding in 2003, parents without access to caregivers would bring their children to the courtroom with them; a setting that, through the eyes of a child, can be intimidating and frightening. A place where parents' heated arguments over divorce, child custody, restraining orders and more, are unleashed— igniting fear and confusion in the hearts and minds of the children who sit there, watching in fear.

Rachel was a victim of domestic violence. Initially, her husband was verbally abusive to her and their two daughters. As time went on, his attacks escalated from pushing to more aggressive physical contact. Without family in town and afraid to confide in friends, she felt increasing isolated. Her two young daughters, Katy and Lexi, witnessed more than they could understand. She knew she had to act and filed a restraining order. The abuse escalated and she hired an attorney. Court Care was

there for Katy (age 3) and Lexi (age 5) during numerous court appearances and Rachel was grateful for this convenient, safe, nurturing, fun, and educational environment for her children while she was in the courtroom. They painted, assembled puzzles, played at the water table, and listened to a story read by a Court Care staff member.

Katy and Lexi's faces lit up every time they walked in. **And**

at the end of every visit, each received—along with the other Court Care kids—a take-home craft and book from the collection that generous donations helped purchase.

The case was eventually resolved with a guilty plea. The proceedings were much less contentious than anticipated as a result of the children not sitting in the courtroom.

We often hear appreciation from parents about how much fun their children had at Court Care. Rachel went a step further.

She approached the Judge at the end of the trial and shared the influence of Court Care on her

family during this exceedingly difficult period. Judges in the 4th Judicial District are strong advocates for Court Care, however Rachel made an unusual impression and has had a profound impact on how



Rachel shared her experience, "I am so grateful to Court Care. There are so many things being discussed in the courtroom that would only be confusing and frightening for Katy and Lexi. The Court Care staff is invaluable to me. I was able to focus on court proceedings without being distracted and worrying about what the girls would hear. I was amazed that they were not traumatized or worried about their family's situation. The girls looked forward to seeing their special friends."

Court Care for the Pikes Peak Region is a 501(c)(3) that provides free, licensed, drop-in childcare to families that have courtrelated business in the Fourth Judicial District (serving El Paso and Teller Counties) and in Colorado Springs Municipal Court. In partnership with Early Connections Learning Center, Court Care welcomes children ages 6 weeks to 14 years. They offer a safe, secure, and nurturing environment conveniently located inside the Courthouse. While children learn and play at Court Care, parents give their undivided attention to their legal proceedings. Since its founding in 2003, Court Care has cared for more than 68,407 children.

Letter from the Co-Presidents

Dear Friends and Colleagues,

Thank you for helping make this another successful year for Court Care. With your support, Court Care welcomed 4,094 children from 2,782 families into its nurturing, calm, colorful space in fiscal year 2019–2020. Court Care remains open during the COVID-19 crisis. Although the courthouse was closed to all but emergency hearings, Court Care was able to provide care for children whose parents were seeking protection orders, challenged custody, or were victims of crime. Children who were exposed to abusive and neglectful circumstances in other parts of their lives could just be children and paint, play, or engage with other children during their time at Court Care. Struggling parents had the freedom to speak with dignity and the right to fully participate in their legal proceeding without their children seeing, hearing, or possibly distracting them. Judicial personnel appreciated the impact of Court Care as court proceedings ran more efficiently.

Our partnership with Early Connections Learning Centers continues to be an asset to the program. Their leadership has guided our team through these challenging months, assuring there would be no pause in services.

Court Care is a necessary blessing in the courthouse. The program provides not just a safe haven for children free from the trauma inherent in courtrooms, but a truly joyful and fun experience. For parents and caregivers, it provides assurance that their children will be isolated from the contentious, confusing conflict that goes on in courtrooms each day.



Financial Overview

Court Care remained open through the Covid-19 crisis. Although activity within the courthouse was limited, families scheduled to appear were grateful to have Court Care as the safety net for their children while they managed court appearances. Court Care's census was significantly lower, however the percentage of crime victims and those seeking protection orders increased. Court Care anticipates an increase in attendance as deferred and rescheduled cases are heard.

Court Care had a successful GIVE Campaign and transitioned to a Virtual Protect the Children 5K Run/ Walk. Generous support from government grants continues to provide the primary funding for the Court Care program. Court Care is grateful for the generosity of the El Paso County Commissioners, local businesses, and our community donors.

The Court Care Protect the Children Endowment Fund at Pikes Peak Community Foundation continues to grow. This Endowment allows Court Care to establish a fund that will ensure sustainability, the ability to expand, and allow for more diversification of funding.


